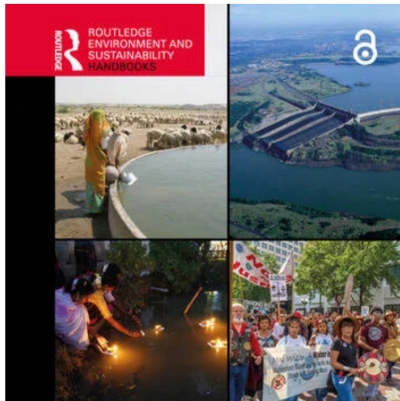


Reflections: Collaborative Adaptive Management

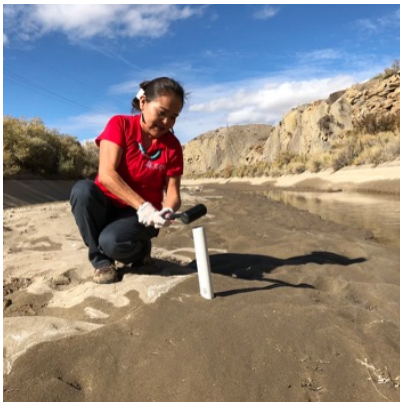
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Routledge Water Diplomacy Handbook Now Available
